

# Pack 88 Summer Camp Instructions

All scouts are to be at their assigned campsite by 12:30pm on Sunday. Scouts may begin to check-in at 11:30am on Sunday. Please Check-in with Mr. Marth as soon as you arrive. Parents will be expected to stay until approximately 4pm, after the Health Lodge Check-in. Please be sure your son has eaten a full lunch or bring one along because dinner is not served until 6pm.

On Friday, please plan on coming up for family day. It is a great way for your son to show you what he has learned during the week. Parents and siblings are welcome. You can come up as early as you want, but we suggest you come up at 1pm and stay through the evening campfire. The boys will be performing a song or skit at the campfire. We would like all parents to be at the site by 3pm. When you drop off your son on Sunday, please let us know approximately what time you will pick him up on Friday.

We are requesting that each Scout pay \$10 toward site decorations and site snacks. Please pay this to the campsite leader.

If you are planning on attending the BBQ dinner on Friday, please let us know. Typically we have some extra tickets to distribute, however, they are on a first come, first serve basis.

Each scout should bring \$10-15 to spend at the Trading Post. Please place the money in a sealed envelope with your child's name and the amount clearly marked on the outside. Please give this envelope to the site leader at check-in.

**Please do not forget your Medical Forms – Scouts or adults with no medical forms will not be allowed to stay at camp!**

## **WHAT SHOULD I PACK?**

We suggest packing all clothes in plastic bins available at Wal-Mart.

### **PERSONAL GEAR**

- Uniform (s) – at least one Full "Class A" uniform -Blue Shorts, Blue Shirt (Webelos – tan or blue shirt), neckerchief, slide, hat. (Please bring Class A on Hanger)
- Several "Class B" T-Shirts (Class B is any cub scout shirt)
- Extra Shirts & Shorts for the entire week
- One pair of long pants
- Socks & Underwear
- Jacket
- Rain gear – Ponchos are best
- Sleep Wear – Most scouts wear long sleeve t-shirt and sweat pants
- Sneakers and /or Hiking Boots (at least two pairs of shoes)
- Swim Wear
- Towels & Toiletries (1 towel for swimming and one for shower)(shower shoes)
- Sleeping Bag or Blankets
- Pillow
- Backpack(daypack)
- Plastic Sports Bottle(preferably 2 with Scout's name on them)
- Flashlight w/extra Batteries
- Handkerchief
- Bug Repellent
- Sun Screen
- Cub Scout Handbooks
- Prescription medicine – please have all medicines in a zip-lock bag with your Son's name clearly marked. All medicine must be in original drug store bottles. Please only send what they will need for the week.
- **Medical Form (completed)**

## **OPTIONAL PERSONAL GEAR**

- Watch
- Camp Chair (folding)
- Cards or non-electronic games
- Camera and Film
- Song Book
- Bible, Prayer Book
- Fishing Pole, Basic Tackle & Bait (Time is set up for those who wish to fish)
- Stationary and Stamps
- Pocket Knife (will be collected and safely stored at check-in)
- Books & Magazines
- Laundry Bag

## **LEAVE AT HOME**

Pets, Fire Works, Fire Arms, Ammunition, Radios, Tape Players, CD Players, Televisions, "Walk-man," Electronic Games, Squirt Guns, Dice, Un-Scout like Literature, Alcohol, and Illegal Drugs and Valuables.

## **LABEL YOUR GEAR**

Cub Scouts should "Mark" all personal Gear. Many times items are lost or misplaced and are never claimed. Items that are marked and found will be announced at evening retreat.

## **MEDICAL FORMS:**

**All Cubs and Leaders** must have a current Medical Form. Cub Scouts and Leaders under 40 need a physical every three years with an attested review annually. Leaders 40 years and over must have a Class III physical within a year prior to your departure from camp.

Example: Your camp date is **7/29/07 to 8/3/07**; your medical must be dated after **8/3/2006**.

## **MEDICATIONS:**

**All Medications must be checked in with the Camp Health Officer.** You will be permitted to keep with you only those medications necessary to sustain life. The Health Officer will dispense only legal medications. Legal Medications are medicines in their original container, label affixed, doctors name, patients name, date and name of medication contained therein. If there has been a dosage change, it must be so noted by your doctor. A weekly pill dispenser box will be permitted if your pharmacist or doctor provides printed information as to the contents.

## **TELEPHONE: Office (570) 629-0599**

The camp pay phone is available for adults on the back porch of the Program building. Cubs must have an adult or their Camp Leader with them in order to use the phone. We also have a FAX in the Camp Office.

## **MESSAGES:**

During the day and evenings we receive a number of calls for campers and leaders. Phone messages will be placed in your mailbox at the Camp Office. Emergency messages will be hand delivered in an expedient and professional manner

**MAIL:**

Mail is delivered on a daily basis. When it arrives, it is sorted and placed in your mailbox at the Camp Office. A pick-up card will denote an oversized letter or parcel. It is the unit's responsibility to check for and pick up the mail after 4:00 PM. Out-going mail should be placed in the mailbox outside of the Trading Post prior to 9:30 am each day.

Every scout likes to get mail – Please pre-write a letter and mail it on Saturday (before your son leaves for camp) this way he gets mail on Monday or Tuesday.


**TRADING POST**
